

Pre-Toddler Assistant Teacher

<u>Job Description:</u> Pre-Toddler Assistant Teachers are responsible for providing and maintaining a loving, nurturing, safe, and educational environment for the children in their care. They report to the Director, Assistant Director, and Lead Teacher with any questions or issues.

Major Responsibilities:

- 1. Manage one classroom of 1-2 year old children.
- 2. Contribute to the creation of a classroom environment conducive to learning and appropriate to the physical development of the children
- Engage the children in academic activities, sensory activities, neuromotor activities, and audiomotor activities, and physical exercise; this means getting down on the floor to interact with them.
- 4. Assist the children in washing their hands before meals.
- 5. Prepare breakfast, lunch, and snack for children and assist those who need help eating.
- 6. Attend to the personal hygiene of each child, ensuring their diapers are changed frequently and their clothes and sheets are changed if they are soiled.
- Make sure the children are well dressed and properly secured in the cart for walks outside.
- 8. Prepare children for nap time; making sure their mats are out, their diapers have been changed, the lights are off, and music is playing.
- 9. Use Brightwheel to ensure that all children that are in your care have been checked in by their family.



- 10. Use Brightwheel to record the schedule of the children and communicate with parents about bringing diapers, wipes, Frida, etc.
- 11. Maintain accurate and appropriate records for the children assigned to your room.
- 12. Maintain a safe environment based on the safety standards set by the Center and State guidelines.
- 13. Maintain a clean classroom to the best of your ability throughout the day, making sure the tables and the floor are clean.
- 14. Clean the classroom thoroughly at the end of the day.
- 15. Work cooperatively and effectively with your Lead Teacher and as a team member; communicating necessary information on a continuous basis.
- 16. Establish a positive, friendly, and open relationship with each child's family and encourage their participation in the program.
